



Restore Louisiana Homeowner Assistance Program

2020 – 2021 HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Budget: \$680,000,000

Status as of 3/1/23:

- Survey launched Feb. 1, 2022
- **\$131 M** in awards offered to **1,705** homeowners
- Number of Surveys Completed: **13,466**
- Number of ERRs completed: **5,520**
- Number of applications invited: **5,524**
- Number of applications submitted: **4,068**

Affordable Rental Housing Programs

SOFT SECOND MORTGAGE PROGRAM

Budget: \$15,000,000

Status:

Launched on January 13 targeting first time homebuyers with annual household income at or below 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI).

MIDDLE-MARKET LOAN PROGRAM

Budget : \$60,000,000

Status:

NOFA development underway

Embeds units with deeper affordability into higher-income areas and encourages socioeconomic integration into communities.

Affordable Rental Housing Programs

PRIME PIGGYBACK PROGRAM

Budget : \$764,000,000

Status:

NOFA released on August 22, 2022 for \$149 million for Hurricanes Laura, Delta and Ida

The Piggyback Resilient Mixed-Income V2 (PRIME-2) NOFA is specifically designed to develop resilient multifamily properties in areas that were greatly impacted by Hurricanes Laura, Delta, and Ida. All projects must be completed by November 15, 2024.

RAPID REHOUSING PROGRAM

Budget : \$15,000,000

Status:

Anticipated NOFA released date is 4/1/2023

Affordable Rental Housing Programs

RENTAL RESTORATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Budget : \$40,000,000

Status:

Application intake period began on Monday, May 1, 2023 and will remain open until Monday, July 31, 2023

The RRDP provides \$32 million in funding through a Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)

PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM

Budget : \$11,000,000

Status:

Anticipated project launch date is April 1, 2023

Economic Development Programs

SMALL BUSINESS LOAN AND GRANT PROGRAM

Budget: \$96,100,000

Status:

- NOFA released Oct. 28, 2022
- Application period for lender closed Nov. 30, 2022
- Lenders selected:
 - South Central Planning & Development Commission, Inc.
 - North Delta Regional Planning and Development District
 - NewCorp, Inc.
 - New Orleans Regional Business Development Loan Corporation
- Technical assistance contractor: Louisiana Chamber of Commerce Foundation

FEMA Match Programs

NONFEDERAL SHARE (PA) MATCH PROGRAM

Budget : \$196,118,380

Status:

- Policy and Procedures documents have been drafted and under final review.
- Kickoff meeting with eligible applicants will be held within the next 30 days.
- Phase I of this program will be match reimbursements for Category A and B.

FEMA Match Programs

HMGP GLOBAL MATCH PROGRAM

Budget : \$77,300,000

Status:

- Policy and procedures documents have been drafted.
- Reviewing submitted projects to determine eligible LMI projects to be selected for global match underway.
- Once projects are selected, applicants will be contacted for completion of the match program application.

Hometown Revitalization Program

AWARD ALLOCATION

Total program budget: \$125,000,000

Status:

- Minimum grant award: \$600,000
- Maximum grant award: \$25 million
- Environmental Review Categorical Excluded not Subject to Section 58.5 is in progress
- Execution of the CEA's are in progress

Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program

TYPES OF PROJECTS

Eligible activities stipulated in 24 CFR 570—Community Development Block Grants Subpart C—Eligible Activities:

These are examples of activities eligible for funding under the Resilient Communities Infrastructure Program

1. Drainage improvements to reduce flooding
2. Rehabilitate or replace existing pump systems
3. Replace or redesign existing structures to mitigate against future disasters
4. Relocating public buildings from a high-risk area through acquisition of new property
5. FEMA ineligible costs
